Collection and transport of semen for post vasectomy semen analysis

To have your sample tested an appointment **MUST** be booked with the laboratory on **01268 524900 ext 8212**.

You will also need the pretested, red-lidded specimen pot for your sample. The sample must be produced at home, it is an offence to masturbate in public toilets.

You have been asked to provide a semen sample so that your doctor can check whether your vasectomy operation has been successful.

To ensure that an accurate result is measured, please follow the instructions below.

- You should NOT ejaculate either through intercourse or by masturbation for at least two days before producing the specimen.
- The first sample must be collected 12 weeks after the operation and after a minimum of 20 ejaculations. A second sample will be required 16 weeks after the operation.
- You will need a pretested red lidded specimen pot for your sample.
- The specimen should be obtained by masturbation and collected directly into the container provided which must be clearly labelled with the patient's name and date of birth and signed by the requesting clinician.
- The sample must be produced at home, it is an offence to masturbate in public toilets.
- A condom should NOT be used for collection of the specimen.
- When collecting the sample, it is important that all of the semen is collected. Sperm are found in the first part of the sample, so it is important that all of the sample is collected.

Specimens should reach the Cellular Pathology Department at Basildon University Hospital **within three hours of collection**.

The Cellular Pathology Department is open between 8.30am and 3.30pm, Monday to Friday. Full directions and a map are printed overleaf.

Please complete the form overleaf and include it with the specimen and a request form signed by the doctor.

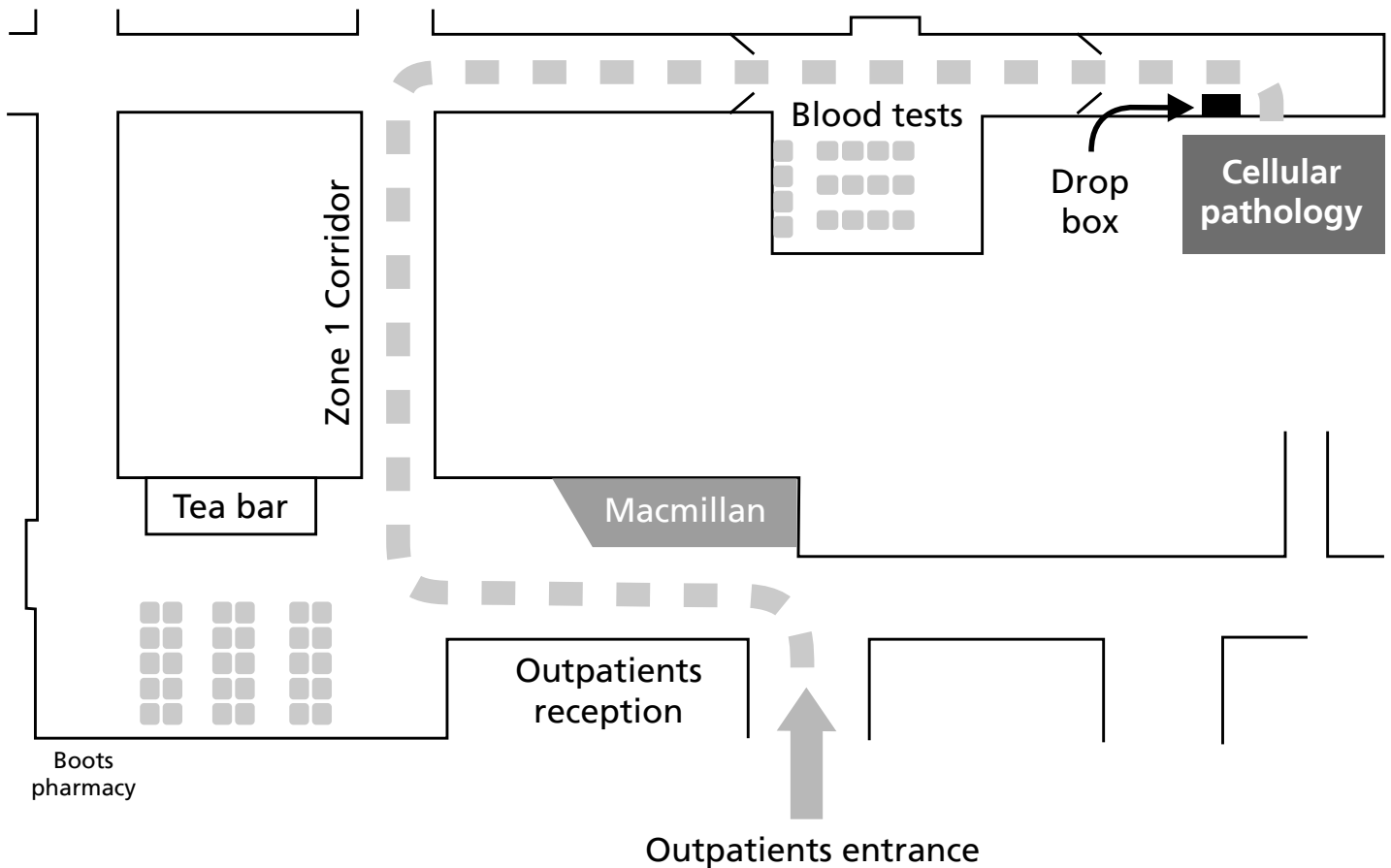

How to find the cellular pathology department



- Enter the hospital via the **Outpatients** entrance
- Turn left past outpatients reception and then right, into the Zone One corridor
- Turn right again at corridor junction, following signs for blood tests
- Go through the blood tests area, past some seating for patients waiting
- Go through the second set of double doors, the red specimen collection box is on the wall, on the right.
- Place your bagged specimen, form and signed tear off slip (below) inside the box.

There is no need to wait. Your results will be sent to the requesting doctor within 3 working days.
